SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES For the year ended 31 December 2018

Reporting entity

Letshego Holdings Limited (the Company) is a limited liability company incorporated in Botswana. The address of the company is Letshego Place, Plot 22 Khama Crescent, Gaborone, Botswana. The condensed consolidated financial statements as at and for the year ended 31 December 2018 comprise the Company and its subsidiaries (together referred to as the "Group"). The Group is primarily engaged in the provision of short to medium-term unsecured loans to employees of the public, quasi-public and private sectors as well as provision of loans to MSE entities.

The condensed consolidated financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2018 have been approved for issue by the Board of Directors on 1 March 2019.

The accounting policies adopted are consistent with those of the previous financial year.

Basis of preparation

These condensed consolidated financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2018 have been prepared in accordance with IAS 34, 'Interim financial reporting'. The condensed consolidated financial statements should be read in conjunction with the annual financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2017, which have been prepared in accordance with IFRS.

The financial statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis except for certain financial instruments which are disclosed at fair value.

Use of judgements and estimates

The preparation of financial statements requires management to make judgments, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of policies and reported amounts of assets and liabilities, income and expenses. The estimates and associated assumptions are based on historical experience and various other factors that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances, the results which form the basis of making the judgments about carrying values of assets and liabilities that are not readily apparent from other sources. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

The estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed by management on an on-going basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognized in the year in which the estimate is revised if the revision affects only that year or in the year of the revision and future years if the revision affects both current and future years.

The significant judgements made by management in applying the Group's accounting policies and the key sources of estimation uncertainty were the same as those applied in the consolidated annual financial statements of the Group for the year ended 31 December 2017.

NOTES TO THE CONDENSED CONSOLIDATED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS For the year ended 31 December 2018

1 Impact of adopting IFRS 9

1.1 Financial Instruments

Impairment: IFRS 9

The introduction of the impairment requirements of IFRS 9 Financial Instruments, implemented on 1 January 2018, require impairment loss allowances to be considered on a more forward looking basis and on a broader scope of financial instruments than is the case under IAS 39 and as a result will have a material impact on the Group's financial condition. Measurement involves increased complex judgement and risk review.

Transition

As permitted by the transitional provisions of IFRS 9, Letshego Group has elected not to restate comparative figures. Any adjustments to the carrying amounts of financial assets and financial liabilities at the date of transition have been recognised in the opening retained earnings and other reserves at 1 January 2018. The following table illustrates the impact on opening reserves on transition to IFRS 9.

Impairment

Impairments in terms of IFRS 9 are determined based on an Expected Credit Loss (ECL) model, as opposed to an incurred loss model used in IAS 39.

The ECL model applies to financial assets measured at amortised cost and debt instruments at Fair Value Through Other comprehensive Income (FVOCI), lease receivables and certain loan commitments as well as financial guarantee contracts.

Under IFRS 9, loss allowances are measured on either of the following bases:

- 12 month ECLs: these are a portion of the lifetime expected credit losses and represent the amount of expected credit losses that result from default within 12 months after the reporting date.
- Lifetime ECLs: these are ECLs that result from all possible default events over the expected life of a financial instrument.
 The Group recognises an allowance for either 12-month or lifetime ECLs, depending on whether there has been a significant increase in credit risk recognition. Indicators of a SICR include any of the following:
 - 30 days past due rebuttable presumption
 - Considering historical delinquency behavior of accounts that are currently up to date and bucket 1 (1-30 days)
 - Technical/operational arrears with proof that an account remains in arrears after the technical/operational error is fixed
 - Significant adverse changes in business, financial and/or economic conditions in which the client operates

Measurement of ECLs

The measurement of ECLs reflects a probability-weighted outcome, the time value of money and the entity's best available forward-looking information. The abovementioned probability-weighted outcome considers the possibility of a credit loss occurring and the possibility of no credit loss occurring, even if the possibility of a credit loss occurring is low. Credit losses are measured as the present value of all cash shortfalls (i.e. the difference between the cashflows due to the entity in accordance with the contract and the cashflows that the Group expects to receive). ECLs are discounted at the effective interest rate of the financial asset.

The assessment of the ECL of a financial asset or portfolio of financial assets entails estimations of the likelihood of defaults occurring and of default correlations between counterparties. The group measures ECL using probability of default (PD), exposure at default (EAD) and loss given default (LGD). These three components are multiplied together and adjusted for the likelihood of default.

The calculation of ECL incorporates forward-looking information. The Group has performed historical analyses and identified the key economic variables impacting credit risk and ECL for each portfolio at subsidiary level. These economic variables and their associated impact on the PD, EAD and LGD do not vary by financial instrument. The Group uses BMI Research/Fitch Solutions to assist in the forecast of economic variables and an overview of the economy quarterly or more often if necessary.

24 FINANCIAL RISK MANAGEMENT

Introduction and overview

The Group has exposure to the following risks from financial instruments:

- credit risk
- liquidity risk
- market risk
- operational risk

The condensed consolidated interim financial statements do not include all financial risk management information and disclosures required in the annual financial statements; they should be read in conjunction with the group's annual financial statements as at 31 December 2018. There have been no changes in the risk management department or in any risk management policies since the year end.

24.1 Risk management framework

The Board of Directors has overall responsibility for the establishment and oversight of the Group's risk management framework, read in conjunction with the group's annual financial statements as at 31 December 2018.

The Board has established the Group Audit and Risk Committee ("GARC"), Group Human Resources Committee ("GHRC"), Investment Committee, Group Management Committee ("GMC") and subsidiary companies' Country Management Committees ("CMC") which are responsible for developing and monitoring Group risk management policies in their respective areas. All Board committees have both executive and non-executive members, apart from the GMC which comprises of executive directors and senior management and reports regularly to the Board of Directors and its sub committees on their activities.

The Group's Enterprise Risk Management framework is established to identify and analyze the risks faced by the Group, to set appropriate risk limits and controls, and to monitor risks and adherence to limits. Risk management policies and systems are reviewed regularly to reflect changes in market conditions, products and services offered. The Group, through its training and management standards and procedures, aims to develop a disciplined and constructive control environment, in which all employees understand their roles and responsibilities.
